
If the commission wishes to discuss possible AMA events we can attend the December 7 meeting or any future monthly meetings.

Gardner Jan4, 2023 BOD and AMA Meeting:

After introductions of Gardner Airport BOD members and AMA officers and members, the AMA District VP, Andy Argenio, and the AMA members engaged in discussion with the BOD on having AMA-sanctioned RC flying events once again at the Gardner Airport.

We provided AMA handouts to the BOD members and talked about and showed photos of AMA's history of the variety of AMA events that we had conducted at Gardner and other New England airports. We discussed our FAA CBO status, safety programming, insurance, and how we conduct events from marketing to public engagement and the potential benefits for the airport and the community. We talked about food vendors, RV and trailer parking, camping, and possible spectator, parking, and pilot fees.

We understood that the BOD's interest was to bring activities back to the airport that would benefit the community and the airport. Rather than a specialty event, we felt that an "AMA District Sponsored Aeromodelling Festival" from Thursday thru Sunday featuring all the popular aeromodelling flying with ample time slots for compatible aircraft flying groups as well as times for mixed sport flying would have the best community appeal for both spectators and pilots. Of most importance were the dates that might be available for events this year that wouldn't conflict with the airport's two-month runway construction project that's scheduled to start the last week of June.

The 5 BOD members in attendance were impressed with our presentation and all voted YES to offering the AMA a 4-day event sometime around June before the construction on the runway starts or after. We emphasized that the sooner event dates could be confirmed the more time we would have to market the event and that if it were too late in the season we would have to consider 2024.

NEW ENGLAND states were the hardest hit by the rainstorm and flooding of March 29 through 31. Rainfall total was highest in Rhode Island with 9.97 inches.

I bring this up because my club's access road to the flying field is ½ mile in length and sustained considerable damage. In numerous sections, there are washouts across the road making passage to the flying field impossible.

AMA Document 714, the Club Disaster Assistance Program, is designed to grant immediate financial assistance to AMA chartered clubs that have flying sites damaged by a natural disaster. The purpose of the grant is to assist clubs in making their flying field once again accessible and usable for club members.

The grant is limited to \$500 per club and the club must provide adequate pictures and information on the application to qualify. Note that this is a grant and no repayment to AMA is necessary.

I mailed district clubs this message in early April and if your club flying site sustained damage, you might want to apply for this financial assistance.

District I will be sponsoring four flying events again this year. The two following events have no fees for pilots or spectators.

The first event is the Multi-Club Fly-In described in the following advertisement. I have written about this event before and you may recall that it was conceived by my friend, Bill O'Donnell, several years ago.

It has become an annual event growing larger with nearly 60 registered pilots representing more than a dozen District I clubs last year. The new officers of the South Shore Radio Control host club welcome guest fliers from throughout the district to attend and fly all types of RC aircraft.







Ray Labonte, District I associate vice president, contacted me in October 2011 to discuss his plans for the 2012 Maine Jet Rally. Ray decided to expand the event to include RC helicopter, micro electric, CL Combat, night flying, and RC truck driving. An air show was scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, and Saturday night fireworks and a lobster and steak barbecue was also planned.

Ray sought sponsorship from his hobby business, the hobby industry, AMA, the Maine Office of Tourism, and others. Horizon Hobby has been doing an event in Europe called Horizon Air Meet Germany, which mirrored the type of event Ray was planning. His meetings with Horizon and a visit by Horizon executives to the Sanford Regional Airport resulted in a partnership for Horizon Air Meet USA 2012, which

included a Maine Jet Rally. Horizon's participation, primary funding, and marketing made the first and largest event of its type in the US possible.

The Sanford Airport provided an enormous open space to accommodate the events. The gathering showcased the skills of the best RC pilots and drivers in the world. Spectators were treated to a spectacular air show featuring full-scale flights by aerobatic champion's Matt Chapman and Rob Holland.

More than 20,000 spectators, including 700 students from area schools, and 300 pilots, drivers, and helpers attended. "Try-me" stations were set up for attendees to try their hands at the controls of RC buggies and model airplanes.

AMA presence included Bob Brown, Gary Fitch, Dave Mathewson, and District I officers. Plans for AMA to provide attendees with flight simulators, informational handouts, and hands-on building of Delta Dart airplane kits were foiled when the AMA trailer was involved in an accident en route to the event. The trailer and its contents were destroyed.

The event was a tremendous success and the AMA thanks Horizon
